



- 3. TC from the institution last attended.
- 4. Conduct certificate from the Head of the institution last attended.
- 5. Community certificate issued by the authorities concerned to prove the community.
- 6. Threepassport size photos recently taken.

Note: Parents/Guardians should be present at the time of admission

GENERAL RULES

- 1. College hours are from 9 am to 3.45 pm on the normal working days.
- 2. Identity card is compulsory to all students in the campus. It should be produced to authorities for verification at any time and at the time of issuing TC
- 3. Personal cleanliness and hygiene is expected from all students
- 4. College uniform is compulsory in the campus
- 5. Students are expected to wear neat and decent dress and to behave in decorous manner
- 6. Ornaments or flowers should not be worn by any student when she is in the college uniform
- 7. The students are prohibited from entering class rooms, laboratories, office, staff room etc except when they are expected to be there.
- 8. Loitering in the veranda and corridor is strictly prohibited.
- 9. Any damage caused to furniture, library books, laboratory equipments and other properties of college must be replaced by the student concerned.

- 14. All students should participate actively in all the curricular, co-curricular and extracurricular activities.

- 16. The day scholars are not permitted to go to the hostel. The hostel inmates are not allowed to go to the hostel during class hours.
- 17. Students should not go out of the campus during class hours without the permission of the principal.
- 18. Studentscannot attend the classes and labs without uniform.
- 19. Irregular attendance, habitualnegligence, disobedience and disrespect to authorities, any kind of cheating, theft etc are sufficient reasons for taking actions against the students.Principal will impose punishments such as fines,cancellation of attendance,withholding Attendance and Progress Certificate (APC), suspension from thecollege etc.
- 20. Litter is to be disposed of only in the place /basket allotted for the same.
- 21. Transport facility is available to the day scholars coming from distant places on the routes determined by the authorities on remitting the charges fixed for each place.
- 22. Messages communicated by the principal to the parents/ guardians should be promptly responded.

ATTENDACE AND LEAVE

EXAMINATION RULES

- 1. There will be University examinations at the end of each semester
- 2. The University will conduct practical examinations at the end of 4th and 6th semesters.(UG)
- 3. Both theory and practical University examinations will be ofthree-hour duration.
- 4. A question paper may contain objective, short answer, paragraph and essay type questions.
- 5. The evaluation scheme for each course consists of both internal (20marks) and external evaluation (80 marks)
- 6. Both internal and external evaluation will be carried out using direct Grading System.
- 7. Project evaluation will be conducted at the end of sixth semester.(UG)
- 8. The internal evaluation will be based on a predetermined transparent system involving periodic written tests, assignments, seminars and attendance in respect of theory courses and based on written tests, lab skill/records/viva and attendance in respect of practical courses.
- 9. Direct grading system based on a 5-point scale issued to evaluate the performance (External and Internal) of students.
- 10. An aggregate of C grade (Internal+ External) is required in each course for a pass and for awarding a degree.
- 11. A student who fails to secure a minimum grade for a pass in a course is permitted to write the examination along with next batch.
- 12. For the successful completion of a semester, a student should pass all courses and score a minimum Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA)) of 2.0.However, a student is permitted to move to the next semester irrespective of her SGPA.
- 13. There is provision for inter collegiate and inter university transfer in 3rd and 5th semester within a period of 2 weeks from the date of commencement of the semester subjected to University norms.
- 14. An overall letter grade (Cumulative Grade) for the whole programme will be awarded to the student based on the value of Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) using a 7-point scale, which is the criterion for ranking the students.

- 15. Attendance: the minimum requirement of attendance during a semester shall be 75% for each course. Condonation of shortage of attendance to a maximum of 10 days in a semester subject to a maximum of two times during the whole period of a degree programme is granted by the University. The certificate of attendance and progress (APC) required for admission to a University examination will be forwarded only if the condition are satisfactory. Benefits of attendance are granted to the students who attend to University union activities, meetings of University bodies and participation in extracurricular activities on production of participation /attendance. Certificate to a maximum of 10 days in a semester.
- 16. Extension activities: Compulsory social service (CSS) for a period of 30 days is essential for the successful completion of a UG Programme.
- 17. A student who registered for the course should complete within 6 years from the year of registration.

ISSUE OF CERTIFICATES

- 1. Application for certificates including Transfer Certificate should ordinarily be made at least two days in advance.
- 2. Conduct Certificates will ordinarily be issued along with TC
- 3. Certificates will be issued only if the Principal is satisfied with the reason stated by the applicant and a fee of Rs.5 is charged per certificate.
- 4. Certificates kept in the office will be returned only after clearing all the dues in the college and the hostel.

NSS UNIT

A unit of National Service Scheme is functioning in the college. Hundred students are enrolled as Volunteers. Each volunteer should have to work minimum of 240 hours in a year and should participate in a special camp of ten days. Such volunteer will be awarded bonus mark for admission.

CSS

Compulsory Social Service is necessary to all the degree students. Thirtyhours work should be done during the course.

EXTENSION PROGRAMMES

Literary Forum, Class Magazine, News Letter, Annual Printed Magazine, Oratory Club, Talks by eminent scholars and educationalists on Arts and Culture, Computer, Medicine, Psychology, Personality development, Social work etc will be organized.

Community development programmes including concretization programme, literacy programs; awareness classes about planning, communicable diseases, community cleaning programs; Cultural programs to the rural community people, compulsory social service etc are some of the other programs are organized by the institution.

Students will also be given opportunities for library extension services such as documentation, article review. Discussions on the topics of social, moral, political and natural issuesetc.

Arts day, Sports day, Study tour, College day, Model Parliament, Sahithya Samajam, Seminars, Quiz, Symposium, Rural Camps, and Moral Camps etc will be organized. Festival and important days are celebrated with zeal and enthusiasm.

A centralized computer lab with internet facility is made available for staff and students.

LIBRARY AND READING ROOM RULES
