

ADMISSION RULES

University of Calicut introduces Centralized admission process for admission to UG Programmes in its affiliated colleges. Online admission under CAP is compulsory for UG admission. College application for admission can be had from the college office on payment of Rs.200/- in person. Cheques and DDs will not be accepted. Attested copies of mark lists of qualifying examination should be submitted along with the application for admission. All the Candidate should produce the CAP print out and allotment memo at the time of admission. The candidates who do not appear for the interview on the day fixed in the allotment memo will not be eligible for admission. Admission will be finalized only after the interview. The parent/guardian should be present at the time of interview.

Candidate seeking admission to UG/ PG Programmes should produce the following documents at the time of interview. (Three attested copies each)

- 1. Qualifying Certificates: SSLC/Higher Secondary/Senior secondary/ Degree Certificates
- 2. TC from the institution last attended
- 3. Conduct certificate from the head of the institution last attended
- 4. Genuine Certificate (in case of NIOS)
- 5. Equivalency certificate(Board of other states)
- 6. Recent Passport size photograph- 3 copies
- 7. Attested copies of certificates for the dependents of Ex-Servicemen and Freedom fighter, N.S.S, N.C.C, Arts & Sports etc. and certificate proving physical disabilities, if any should be attached with the application.

NB: Original certificates submitted to the college will be returned only after the completion of the course. Therefore students are advised to keep enough attested copies of the certificates for their future use.

GENERAL RULES

- 1. College hours are from 9 am to 3.30 pm on the normal working days.
- Identity card is compulsory to all students in the campus. It should be produced to authorities for verification at any time and at the time of issuing TC.
- 3. Personal cleanliness and hygiene is expected from all students.

- 4. College uniform is compulsory in the campus.
- 5. Students are expected to wear neat and decent dress and to behave in decorous manner.
- 6. Ornaments or flowers should not be worn by any student when she is in the college uniform.
- 7. The students are prohibited from entering class rooms, laboratories, office, staff room etc except when they are expected to be there.
- 8. Loitering in the veranda and corridor is strictly prohibited.
- 9. Any damage caused to furniture, library books, laboratory equipments and other properties of college must be replaced by the student concerned.
- 10. Perfect discipline and decorum should be maintained.
- 11. Students should not remain in the classroom during free hours. They should go to library.
- 12. Holding meetings, collecting funds etc without obtaining the prior permis sion of the principal will be punished.
- 13. Using private electric and electronic gadgets are not allowed in college and in the hostels. Fine will be levied against those students.
- 14. All students should participate actively in all the curricular, co-curricular and extracurricular activities.
- 15. Muslim students should be regular in their daily prayers and other religious observances.
- 16. The day scholars are not permitted to go to the hostel. The hostel inmates are not allowed to go to the hostel during class hours.
- 17. Students should not go out of the campus during class hours without the permission of the principal.
- 18. Students cannot attend the classes and labs without uniform.
- 19. Irregular attendance, habitual negligence, disobedience and disrespect to authorities, any kind of cheating, theft, ragging etc. are sufficient reasons for taking actions against the students. Principal will impose punishments such as fines, cancellation of attendance, withholding Attendance and Progress Certificate (APC), suspension from the college etc.
- 20. Litter is to be disposed of only in the place /basket allotted for the same.
- 21. Messages communicated by the principal to the parents/ guardians should be promptly responded.
- 22. Using of mobile phones in the college campus is strictly prohibited and if confiscated a fine of Rs.1000 will be charged.

- 23. Wi-Fi facility available for final year students doing projects.
- 24. The following articles are not allowed in the college:
 - 1. Periodicals, magazines or books other than college / library books.
 - 2. Money or valuable articles like ornaments, mobile phones etc.
 - 3. Video /Audio CD, VCD, electronic games and other undesirable printedmaterials.
- 25. Every student should endeavor to attain academic excellence, to imbibe moral values and to uphold the reputation of the college.

ATTENDACE AND LEAVE

- 1. Hourly attendance is compulsory to all students. Late comers should enter class only with the permission of the class teacher.
- 2. No student is allowed to leave the class room without the permission of the lecturer-in-charge.
- 3. Leave application for absence in the class should be submitted to the class teacher sufficiently early or on the next day of availing the leave.
- 4. Leave application should be countersigned by parent.
- 5. A student absent for an hour will be considered as absent for half day.
- 6. If a student called for any club activities, she should get the permission from coordinator and hand over it to the class teacher.
- 7. Students who are continuously absent in the class for more than 5 days without leave or without information should bring their parents / guardian before entering the class.
- 8. The name of the student who is continuously absent in the class for more han 15 days will be removed from the rolls. However, the principal could re-admit the student if satisfied with the explanation offered by parent/guardian. In such cases re-admission fee has to be remitted.

TRANSPORTATION FACILITIES

Transportation facility is available to the day scholars coming from distant places on the routes determined by the authorities on remitting the charges fixed for each place.

POINTS TO REMEMBER

- 1. Advance payment of 3 months bus fee should be paid at the time of admission / commencement of classes.
- 2. The bus fee for each month should be paid on or before the first day of nex month.

- 3. The cancellation of bus facility, if needed any, the request has to be submitted a month before.
- 4. In case of early exit, for a student availing bus facility, she has to inform the office with the signature of class teacher.
- 5. Change of bus/bus stop will be allowed only after the special permission sanctioned from the concerned authority and the student should submit the request letter signed by parent.
- 6. Request for bus facility after cancellation once, will be accepted only after the sanctioning of concerned authority.

TUTORIAL SYSTEM

Tutorial System is introduced for all classes. The Teacher-in-charge is entrusted to keep individual attention of each student of her class. The Class-PTA meeting will be conducted twice in every semester and is intended to have effective co-ordination between the students, teachers and parents.

STUDENT'S UNIFORM

Students are expected to wear neat and decent dresses. Wine red color churidar top (without slit) and bottom, with shawl is the uniform for UG students. Light blue color churidar top (without slit) and bottom, with shawl is the uniform for PG students. Muslim students should wear black color scarf. Full sleeve is compulsory to all students (Muslim & Non Muslim).

ISSUE OF CERTIFICATES

- Application for Transfer Certificate should ordinarily be made at least two days in advance.
- 2. Conduct Certificates will ordinarily be issued along with TC.
- 3. Certificates will be issued only if the Principal is satisfied with the reason stated by the applicant.
- 4. Certificates kept in the office will be returned only after clearing all the dues in the college and the hostel.

FEE STRUCTURE

Tuition fee is to be paid in lump sum every year. Students who do not pay the fee on the prescribed date will not be permitted to attend the class. Hall tickets will be issued only after clearing the dues

UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION RULES

- 1. There will be University examinations at the end of each semester
- 2. The University will conduct practical examinations at the end of every even semesters.
- 3. Both theory and practical University examinations will be of three-hour duration.
- 4. The question paper may contain objective, short answer, paragraph and essay type questions.
- 5. The evaluation scheme for each course consists of both internal (20marks) and external evaluation (80 marks)
- 6. Project evaluation will be conducted at the end of sixth semester(UG) and at the end of forth semester(PG).
- 7. The internal evaluation will be based on a predetermined transparent system involving periodic written tests, assignments, seminars and atten dance in respect of theory courses and based on written tests, lab skill/re cords/viva and attendance in respect of practical courses.
- 8. Indirect grading system based on 7-point scale is used to evaluate the performance of students.
- 9. An aggregate of E grade with 40% marks (Internal+ External) is required in each course for a pass and for awarding a degree.
- 10. A student who fails to secure a minimum grade for a pass in a course is permitted to write the examination along with next batch (Supplementary).
- 11. For the successful completion of a semester, a student should pass all courses and score Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) for that semester. However, a student is permitted to move to the next semester irrespective of her SGPA.
- 12. There is provision for inter collegiate and inter university transfer in 3rd and 5th semester within a period of 2 weeks from the date of commence ment of the semester subjected to University norms.
- 13. An overall letter grade (Cumulative Grade) for the whole programme will be awarded to the student based on the value of Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) calculated at the end of a programme, which is the criterion for ranking the students

14. Attendance:

- The minimum requirement of attendance during a semester shall be 75% for each course.
- ii. A student can appear for a university exam by paying condonation fee, only if the shortage of attendance is to a maximum of 10 days.
- iii. If it is more than 10 days it will be treated as NO APC.
- iv. During the whole period of degree programme a student can pay the condonation for the maximum of 2 times.
- v. The certificate of attendance and progress (APC) required for admis sion to a University examination will be forwarded only if the condition are satisfactory.
- 15. A student who registered for the course should complete within 6 years from the year of registration.

LIBRARY AND READING ROOM

The College maintains a well-stocked and automated library with over 11211 books, The books are classified and catalogued. The library subscribes 32 periodicals and multiple copies of different news papers.. E-books and internet facility are also available.

LIBRARY RULES

- 1. All the students and the members of staff of the college are the members of college library.
- 2. All the members should pay caution deposit.
- 3. Books are issued to the students on the basis of reader's ticket.
- 4. Duplicate cards will be issued on payment of Rs.50/-
- 5. No student can take more than one book at a time.
- 6. Librarian may recall a book any time.
- 7. Books should be returned on or before the stamped date.
- 8. Members should not sub lend the books of library.
- 9. Only back volumes of magazines and journals will be issued for reference and reading.
- 10. Departmental libraries are also functioning and students can get books from there.

- 11. The penal cost for loss of book borrowed from the library by the students and the members of staff are as follows:
 - (i) Three times the face value of the book, which is published after 1980.
 - (ii) Five times value of the book published before 1980.
- 12. If the date of return of a book happens to be a holiday, it shall be returned on the following working day.
- 13. Library will be kept open from 8 am to 5 pm on all working days and Saturdays.
- 14. All students are required to register their entry and exit time in the library usage register.
- 15. Students are not allowed to take any personal belongings to the library other than paper and pen.
- 16. Strict silence should be maintained in the library and reading room.
- 17. Students are advised to see the library notice board daily.

CAREER GUIDANCE AND PLACEMENT CELL

The Cell assists the students to overcome the difficulties and clears the doubts regarding the career options. The cell offers career and course guidance services to the students and conducts coaching classes for candidates appearing for various competitive examinations. The service of agencies like CIGI and University Guidance Bureau will be sought to provide employment guidance to students. The students are also regularly informed about the latest employment opportunities.

RESEARCH PROMOTION COUNCIL

A research committee has been constituted in the campus to enhance the research activities of students and staffs. The aim of the council is to promote the teachers and PG students to participate in National/ Regional Workshops and also helps in enhancing research writing skills.

STUDENT'S UNION

The election to the college Union is conducted on the parliamentary model as per para 6.2.4 of the J M Lyngdoh Commission Report. The college union will have a student's general council and an executive. All students are members of student's general council. Executive Committee comprises of Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, General Secretary, UUC, Magazine Editor, Fine arts Secretary and General Captain.

- To promote healthy and responsible participation in extracurricular activities.
- To uphold, implement, and work for the ideals of the college in a befitting manner.
- To train the students in Parliamentary Democracy so that they may be responsible future citizen of India, aware of their duties, responsibilities and rights.

COLLEGE MAGAZINE

To encourage the literary and artistic talents of the students, the College union brings out a magazine every year. The management of the college magazine shall be vested in the magazine committee. The principal being the Editor-in-Chief of the magazine Committe, is the final authority in all matters concerning the college magazine.

MENTOR - MENTEE SYSTEM

The college has a mentoring system, in which 18-20 students are placed under the care of a mentor who is directly responsible for their academic and personal wellbeing. Mentoring is provided by all faculty

members in the light of their personal and professional experience and expertise.

SCHOLAR SUPPORT PROGRAMME (SSP)

The Scholar Support programme is the part of the "New Initiatives in Higher Education" initiated by the Dept. of Higher Education, Govt. of Kerala. SSP aims at imparting additional support to students in curricular areas where extra coaching is required. Special classes and learning materials are also provided to the students.

REMEDIAL COACHING

The college offers special attention to the weaker students. Remedial coaching sessions are provided throughout the year under SSP. Weaker students are identified by the respective tutors and special coaching is given.

NSS

A unit of National Service Scheme is functioning in the college. Hundred students are enrolled as Volunteers. Each volunteer should have to work minimum of 240 hours in a year and should participate in a special camp of ten days. The units undertake various community development oriented projects such as health and hygiene awareness campaigns, environment awareness, blood donation camps, organized charity activities, donated money for pain and palliative care campaigned actively against drugs and use of tobacco.

DISCIPLINARY ACTION COMMITTEE (DAC)

There is a disciplinary action committee in the college. If a student violates the general rules and regulations of the college, the cases will be referred to DAC which is empowered to make necessary investigation and place the findings before the Appellatte Authority (Principal). The decision of the Appellate Authority shall be final and binding on the student.

MOBILE PHONE SEARCH SOUAD

A mobile phone search squad has been constituted as per directions from the government. The squad holds the right to conduct raids confiscates mobile phones and takes disciplinary action against those who bring mobile phones to the campus. Mobile phones, camera and other electronic gadgets for entertainment are prohibited in campus.

SPORTS

The college offers sports and games facilities to all students who desire to develop their potential abilities and qualities of sportsmanship, team spirit and physical exercise. The students are provided an opportunity to participate in the University level sports meets annually.

FEEDBACK MECHANISM

Parents, teachers, students and other stake holders are given opportunity to evaluate teaching learning process, curriculum, student support activities and other initiatives of the college. It is analyzed in an unbiased way and corrections are brought from time to time.

COUNSELING CELL

A counseling centre has been started functioning in the college from where the students would get the assistance to overcome their personal or intra-personal problems and difficulties, if any, through sharing & caring. The college makes provisions for the mental and emotional well being of the students under a well trained counselor.
