ANTI RAGGING CELL

INTRODUCTION:

Ragging is STRICTLY prohibited under the Indian Laws. Anyone found guilty of committing any acts of ragging and /or indulging and / or attempting to indulge in any of its forms will be liable to be punished.

University Grant Commission (UGC)guidelines notified code no F1-16\2009[CPP-II] dated 21/10/2009 On Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions,2009[under section 26(1)(g) of the UGC Act 1956] are strictly implemented at Ansar Women's college.

According to the Honorable Supreme Court of India Ragging constitutes one or more of any acts which may cause or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student.

Measures to Prevent Ragging:

- Mandated Orientation Programme for freshers and parents to familiarize them with the Institutional rules and regulations inclusive of anti-ragging measures, what constitutes ragging and the consequences to be faced.
- Students and parents submit anti-ragging related affidavits to the institutions at the time of admission.
- Awareness programmes on Anti Ragging / street corner meeting/ Rally campaigns are being conducted by our NSS unit periodically.

- Anti-ragging display boards and banners containing the evils of ragging and the administrative actions in the event of ragging are displayed around the campus
- The Squad will work under the overall guidance of anti-ragging committee. The Squad make surprise raids on hostel & other hot spots like College bus stops, Canteen, College bus. etc. and will be empowered to inspect places of potential ragging.
- Hostel wardens are taking effective steps to curb the ragging activities in hostel.
- Installation of CCTV at vantage and vulnerable points in the campus

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

- To maintain decorum in the College and bring a sense of responsibility amongst the students.
- To sensitise students about the evils of ragging and making awareness among the students.
- To initiate action against the erring student




The speaker then told about the punishment for Participation in/or Abetment of Ragging:

- 5. Withholding results.






INTERNATIONAL YOUTH DAY




enhancing global society and to draw attention regarding cultural and legal surrounding youngsters. Also, the day promotes ways to engage youngsters in making positive contributions to their communities.






Ist prize: Shehma KS and Ameena sherin (S1 BCOM FINANCE)


2nd prize: Shimna sherin and Mumthaz A M(S4 BSC MATHS)

Because there is no movement, a tableau is easier to manage than a whole-group improvisation – yet can easily lead into extended drama activities. It can be used to explore a particular moment in a story or drama, or to replicate a photograph or artwork for deeper analysis.

They replicated scenes like human rights violation in in-laws home, schools, colleges, child labour, streets etc.. They produced proper accessories and stage settings to make the idea clear for audience.

Thus the program was a great success that made both participants and audience happy and they applauded the program. They all gave good feedback for the program and congratulated all the students who worked behind this performance.

This program enabled the audience to understand about various human rights violations from the very small cases to the serious cases and awarded them to work against these serious violations as it is harmful for the entire human community.
