Puzzle Club actively conducted Weekly Puzzle competition.





SAVE CHILDREN, SAVE FUTURE CAMPAIGN

The inauguration of the “SAVE CHILDREN, SAVE FUTURE” campaign was conducted on 1st November, 2017. Our esteemed guest of honour **Justice Mohammed Vaseem**, Additional Sessions Judge (POSCO) inaugurated the campaign and delivered the keynote address. **Ms. Sheela Vijayakumar** (District Panchayath President), **Mr. P.O.George** (Chairman of the Child Welfare Committee), **Adv. Pious Mathew**(Public Prosecutor), **K.V.Mohammed**, CEO, Ansari Charitable Trust, **Ms. Sobhana** (Panchayath President), **Mr. K. Jayashankar** (District Panchayat Member), **Mr. Shaju Muhammedunni** (Asst. Secretary, ACT), **Mr. Noor Mohammed** (IT head, Trust member) and **Dr. Mehmood Shihab** (Principal, Ansar Training College for Women) were some of the other dignitaries who contributed with their presence. **Adv. Faritha Ansari**, Principal and Project leader, gave a short description of the Project & of the details of the schools participating in the campaign. An oath was read out by the chairman of the Child Welfare Committee, **Mr. P.O. George**. The school representatives of the various schools and the audience stood to attention and took the oath. **Adv. Pious Mathew**, Public Prosecutor gave an awareness class on “Legal Perspectives of Child Sexual Abuse”.

As a part of the campaign, the College along with the Child Welfare Committee conducted awareness classes in various schools in the district. The Project was well received everywhere and the positive feedback given by students in each school is a proof which highlighted the relevance of the issue. The session was inaugurated by **Mr. Mujeeb Rehman**, Sub judge and Secretary of District Legal Services Authority, Thrissur.

A HELP DESK was formed at each school including the Principal of the School, a child-friendly faculty, two student representatives (suggested by the respective Principals) and a representative from our side. A sitting of the HELP DESK members was arranged on the second Saturdays of each month to resolve issues related to the protection of human rights of Children. Such issues were dealt with seriously and forwarded to the Child Welfare Committee if necessary.

National Service Scheme

As every year NSS activities were held actively. Through an interview 50 students were selected based on behaviour and attitude. We conducted a seven days camp with 50 students at Nayadi colony. We cleaned the roads and were involved in many social activities. The regular activity of 140 hours started by setting up a vegetable garden in the special school and was monitored regularly by the volunteers. This year NSS students had regular visits to special school. The NSS volunteers also visited Thrissur Mental hospital and conducted a few activities there. The special days such as Independence Day, Republic day, Mother's Day, Human Rights Day etc., were celebrated. We conducted poster making competitions, national anthem, patriotic song competitions etc. The discipline for several programmes was supervised by NSS volunteers.

In the academic year 2017-18, the NSS unit conducted a series of activities with the aim of developing capabilities of students and to instil in them clinical sense and social responsibility. The NSS unit of Ansar women's college unit 137 has a strength of 100 volunteers.

International Justice Day


International Justice Day was observed by NSS on 17th July 2017. Several awareness programmes and street play were arranged.

On Fresher's Day, the club arranged a snack corner for the purpose of raising funds for the activities of ASHWAS wing.





ASHWAS volunteers and the faculty member of ASHWAS Committee Prof Noushaja of Commerce Department visited her home to console her.


Thirty thousand rupees was collected by Ashwas Club and handed over to Mr. Ismail Kassim for the construction of his house.
