## **Training Sessions**

This academic year activities of the club ear marked with an informative session on **Palliative Care Education – an overview** by Prof N N Gokuldas the senior volunteer of District Pain and Palliative Unit. He is also one of the founder members of Haemophilia Society Kunnakulam Chapter which is near to our locality. He invited volunteers to the field of palliative work by sharing his own experience with the students.



Being a Women's College, the club's keen concern is the health of the students in the campus. Since cancer is fast spreading the club conducted an awareness programme on Breast Cancer. A survey was held among the students on **Unhealthy food habits**, with the intention of creating an awareness on the same.






