ANTI-RAGGING AWARNESS SESSION

The Anti-Ragging Cell of Ansar Women's College organized an awareness session on 13th August 2024, attended by over 300 second- and third-year students. Led by Advocate Mr. Primon P. Geever from the District Legal Service Authority (DLSA), the session focused on the legal consequences and psychological impact of ragging.

Mr. Geever provided a detailed explanation of ragging as a criminal offense, the institutional responsibilities in preventing it, and the legal repercussions for offenders, including suspension, expulsion, and imprisonment. He also discussed the importance of reporting incidents, the role of Anti-Ragging Committees, and the protection of complainants. In addition, Mr. Geever emphasized the emotional and mental toll of ragging on students, highlighting its long-term effects on academic performance and well-being.

The session aimed to equip students with the knowledge and tools to create a safer, more respectful campus environment.


