#### PAPER BAG MAKING WORKSHOP

The Green Club of Ansar Women's College, Perumpilavu conducted a program called 'Paper Bag Making Workshop' on 3rd July 2024, Wednesday in the College Conference Hall. The program began with a Prayer by Mariyam (S5 BCOM TAXATION), and Pavithra Pradeep of (S5 BCOM TAXATION) welcomed the audience.

On the day, Ms. Ashitha (PG Department of English, Ansar Women's College) felicitated the function and enlightened the students about the harmful effects of plastic bags on the environment and the importance of adopting eco-friendly alternatives. She also motivated the students to take part in the paper bag making session. Ms. Faseela CT, Green Club coordinator, gave a brief talk on the environmental benefits of paper bags and highlighted the theme "Say No to Plastic."

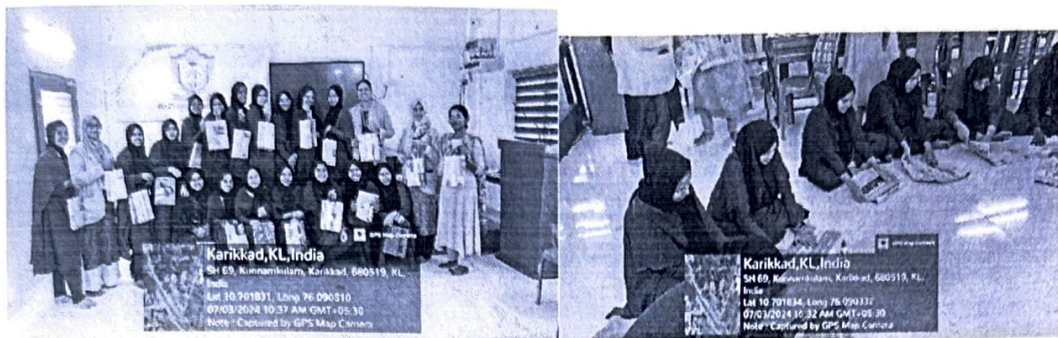
After the official ceremony, a workshop on making paper bags from old newspapers and magazines was conducted by Ms. Fasna KV, a student of S3 BSc Chemistry. The students learned how to make different sizes of paper bags with handles that could be used for shopping and gifting purposes. The workshop was attended by more than 15 students who

## OD FACTORY VISIT

The Green Club of Ansar Women's College, Perumpilavu organized an educational field trip to the Oud Factory in Thrissur on 17th December 2024. A total of 22 students along with 2 faculty members visited the factory, departing from the college campus at 9:00 AM via college bus.


The visit aimed to educate students about sustainable manufacturing processes and how traditional methods can be environmentally friendly in modern times. Upon arrival, the students were welcomed by Mr. Abdul Gafoor, the factory manager, who gave an informative presentation on the history of oud production and its cultural significance.

Students were given a comprehensive tour of the facility, where they learned about the sustainable harvesting of agarwood, the raw material for oud, and how the factory implements zero-waste policies in their production process. The highlight of the visit was a demonstration of the traditional distillation process that requires minimal energy consumption compared to modern methods.

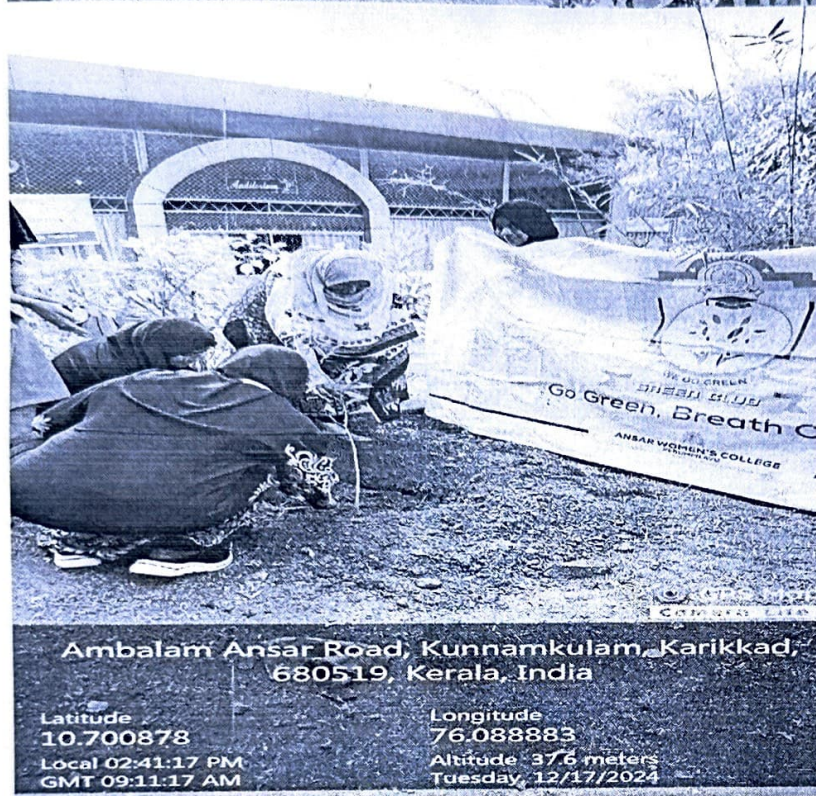
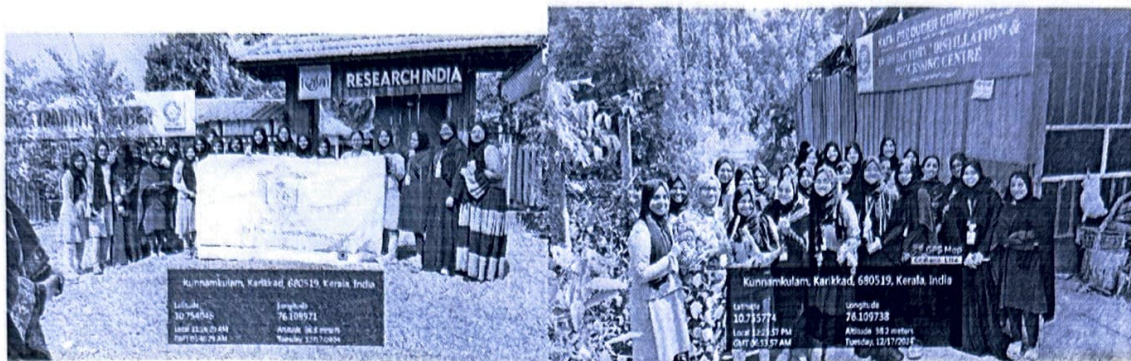
