By setting quality benchmark parameters, the IQAC seeks to improve the overall academic environment of the college. Through strategic planning, effective implementation, and the streamlining of quality initiatives, the IQAC significantly contributes to the development and refinement of institutional processes. Working in close collaboration with the Principal, the IQAC actively fosters a culture of excellence and continuous improvement.

In the context of recent educational reforms introduced through the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the implementation of the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUP) marks a transformative shift in the structure of higher education in India. Recognizing the importance of aligning institutional practices with these national priorities, the IQAC has taken proactive steps to understand, support, and integrate the objectives of NEP 2020, thereby ensuring that the college remains at the forefront of academic innovation and quality advancement.

FIVE DAYS FACUTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME PHASE1

To equip faculty members with the necessary knowledge and pedagogical tools to handle this transition, IQAC conducted a comprehensive six-day Faculty Development Program (FDP) from **May 27th to June 1st, 2024**. FYUGP ENTRY FEST ‘ALOHA 2024 ‘.

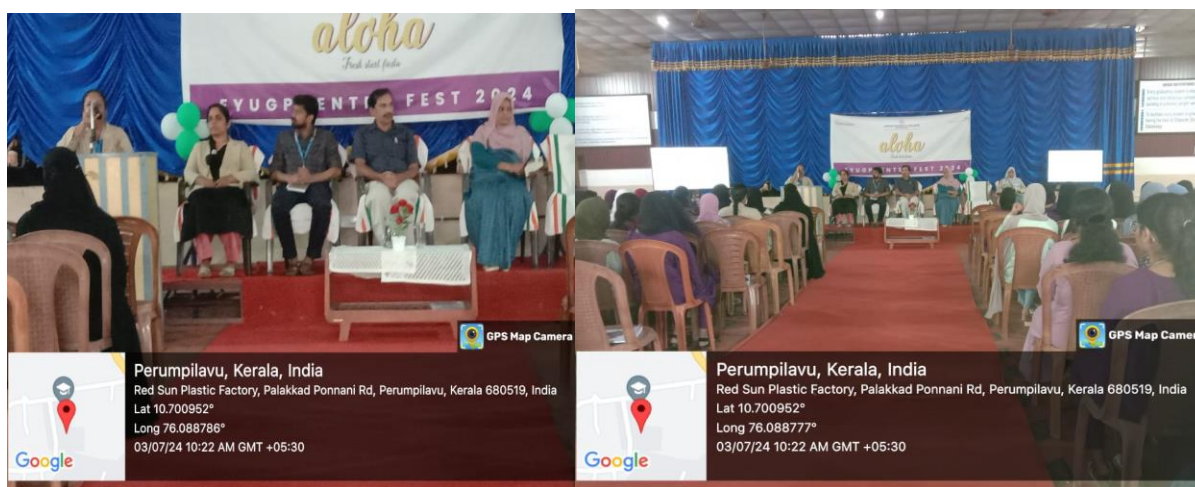

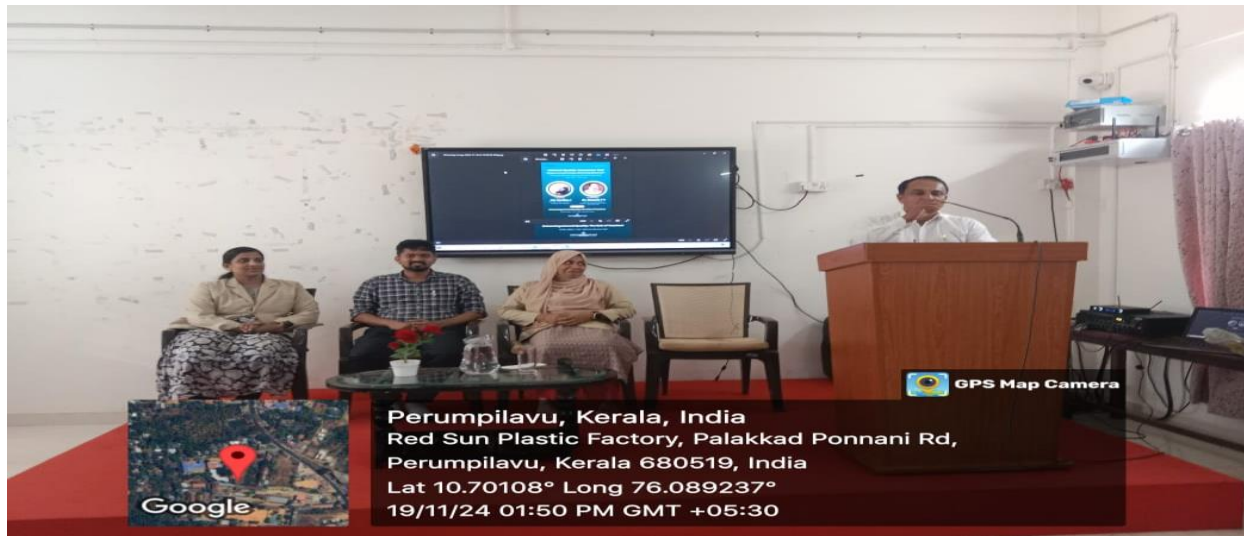

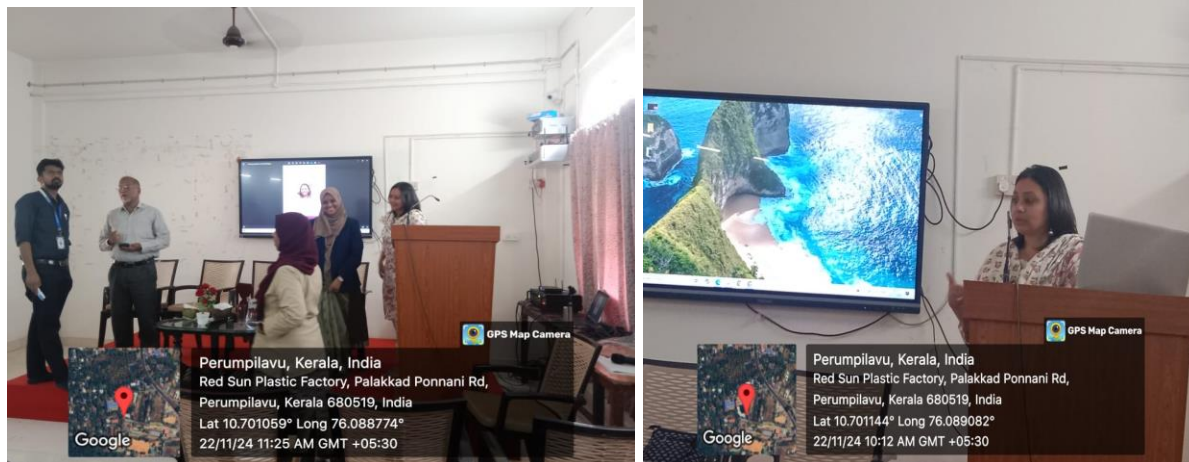




GUEST TALK (SEMINAR) ON GENDER JUSTICE

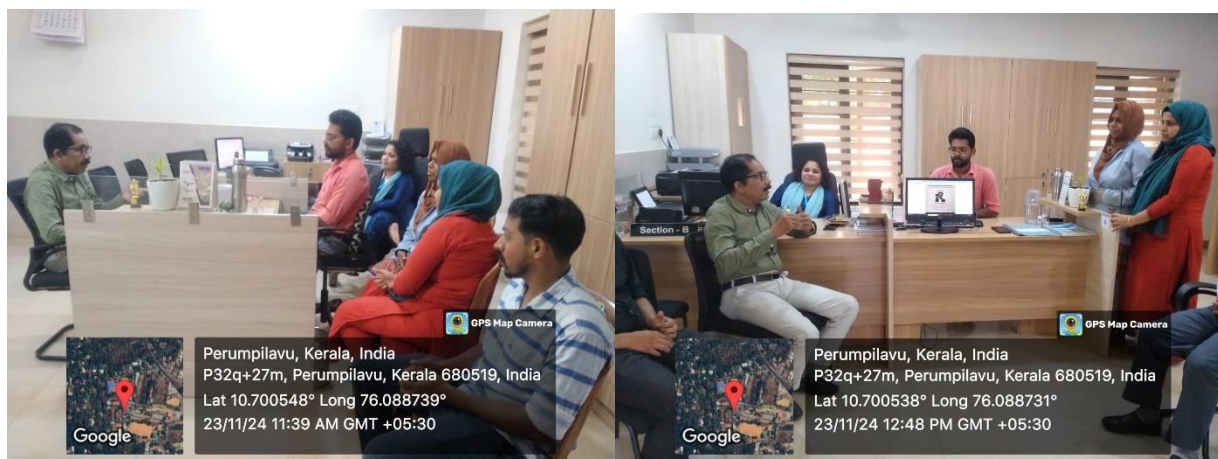

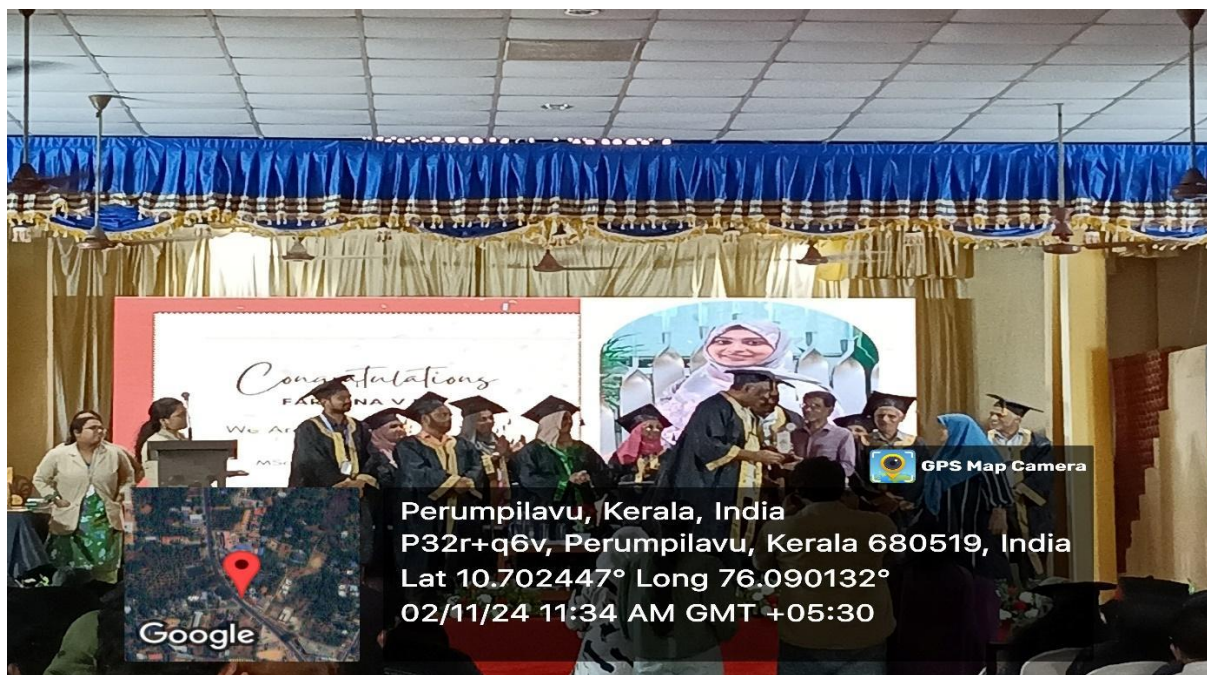

The Scholarship Cell at Ansar Women's College is proud to present the Annual Report for the academic year 2024-2025, highlighting its continued commitment to supporting deserving students through financial assistance and promoting academic excellence.

In alignment with the college's mission to provide inclusive and equitable education, the Scholarship Cell has facilitated numerous scholarships for students from diverse backgrounds. This report outlines the key initiatives undertaken, the scholarship distribution process, and collaborative efforts that have further enriched the impact of our scholarship programs.

1. Scholarship Awareness Session

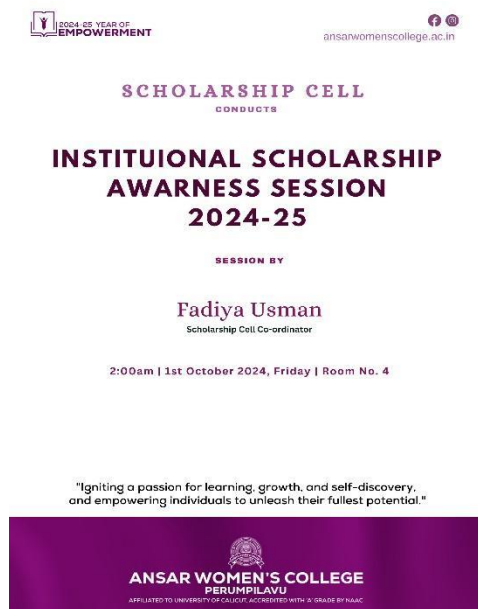
To kickstart the scholarship initiatives for the academic year, a Scholarship Awareness Session was conducted on October 1, 2024, at Room No.4 in the Administrative Block. The session was organized by the Scholarship Cell Coordinator, Ms. Fadiyah Usman K U, and was attended by shortlisted students from various departments.

The primary objective of the session was to ensure students were well-informed about the numerous scholarships available, their eligibility criteria, and the application procedures. The event commenced with an invocation, followed by a warm welcome from Assistant Professor Dreemy Samu K of the Department of Chemistry.

During the session, Ms. Fadiyah Usman elaborated on the following scholarship categories:

- **Scholarships for Academic Excellence** – Recognizing outstanding academic achievers.
- **Promotion of Science Education** – Encouraging students to pursue degrees in science.
- **Support for Economically Backward Students** – Ensuring financial constraints are not a barrier to education.
- **Orphan and Single Parent Scholarships** – Providing special support to students facing parental loss or single-parent challenges.
- **SC/ST and OBC Scholarships** – Promoting equity and inclusion within the academic community.

The session provided students with clear insights into the application process and selection criteria. Queries and concerns raised by the participants were addressed, ensuring transparency and clarity.



2. Scholarship Award Criteria and Distribution

The Scholarship Cell adhered to a transparent and merit-based selection process. Scholarships were awarded based on academic excellence, financial need, and social background. The following criteria were applied for the distribution of scholarships:

- **96% and Above:** Students scoring **96% or higher** in their qualifying examinations were awarded a **full scholarship** covering their tuition fees.
- **90% to 95%:** Students in this range were granted a **50% scholarship** on tuition fees.
- **85% to 90%:** Eligible students were awarded a **20% scholarship** on tuition fees.
- **Promoting Science Education:** Full scholarships were extended to students pursuing undergraduate programs in selected science disciplines.
- **Financially and Socially Backward Students:** Full scholarships were awarded to students from economically disadvantaged backgrounds, irrespective of academic performance.

These scholarships not only served as financial relief but also motivated students to excel academically and contribute positively to the college community.

3. Collaborative Sponsorship with Life Skills Department

A significant milestone achieved during the academic year was the successful collaboration between the Scholarship Cell and the Life Skills Department at Ansar Women's College. This partnership resulted in around 20 students receiving additional sponsorships, further easing their financial burdens.

The Life Skills Department played a pivotal role in identifying students who required extra support. In addition to financial assistance, the department facilitated mentorship programs, career counseling, and personal development workshops. This holistic approach empowered students to navigate both academic and personal challenges effectively.

Through this collaboration, the college reaffirmed its commitment to nurturing well-rounded individuals equipped with the skills necessary for future success.

4. Selection Process

The selection of scholarship recipients was carried out meticulously by a Scholarship Committee comprising:

- Class Teacher
- Head of the Department
- Vice Principal
- Principal

The evaluation process involved a comprehensive review of each applicant's academic records, financial background, personal statements, and recommendation letters. To ensure fairness and accuracy, mentors conducted **home visits** to validate the applicants' financial circumstances. Based on these assessments, the Head of the Department provided recommendations to the Principal.

Shortlisted candidates were further assessed through interviews when necessary. The final decision was made by the Management Committee, and all applicants were duly informed of the outcomes.

5. Conclusion and Way Forward

The Scholarship Cell's initiatives for the academic year **2024-2025** have had a significant impact, ensuring that financial limitations did not hinder the academic progress of deserving students. By providing scholarships and facilitating sponsorships, we have not only reduced the financial burden on students but also fostered a culture of academic excellence and inclusivity.

The collaboration with the Life Skills Department has further strengthened our support system, offering students access to mentorship and development opportunities. 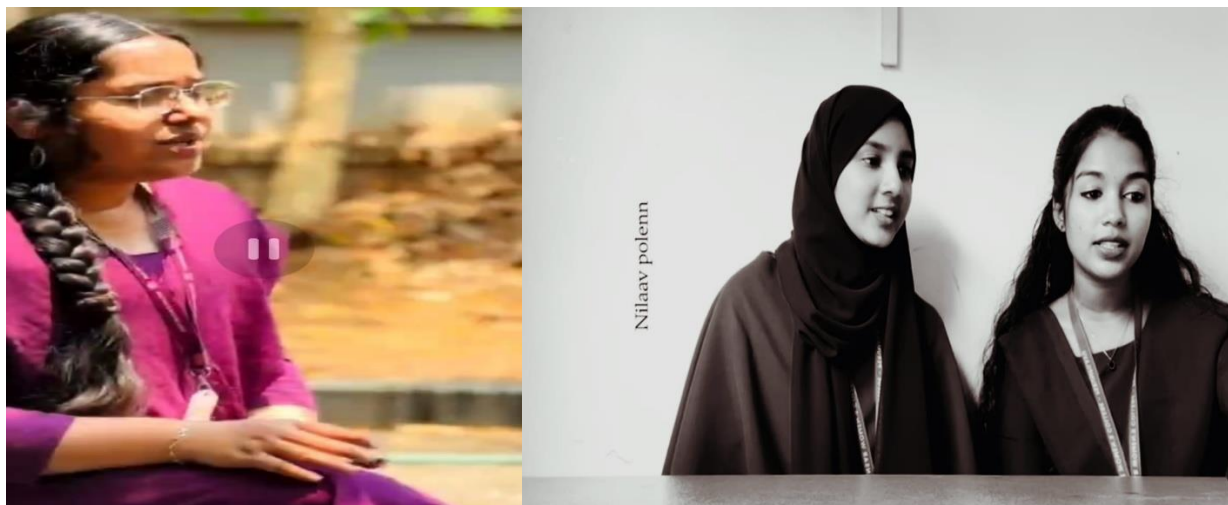
Play back singer P. Jayachandran Anusmaranam:

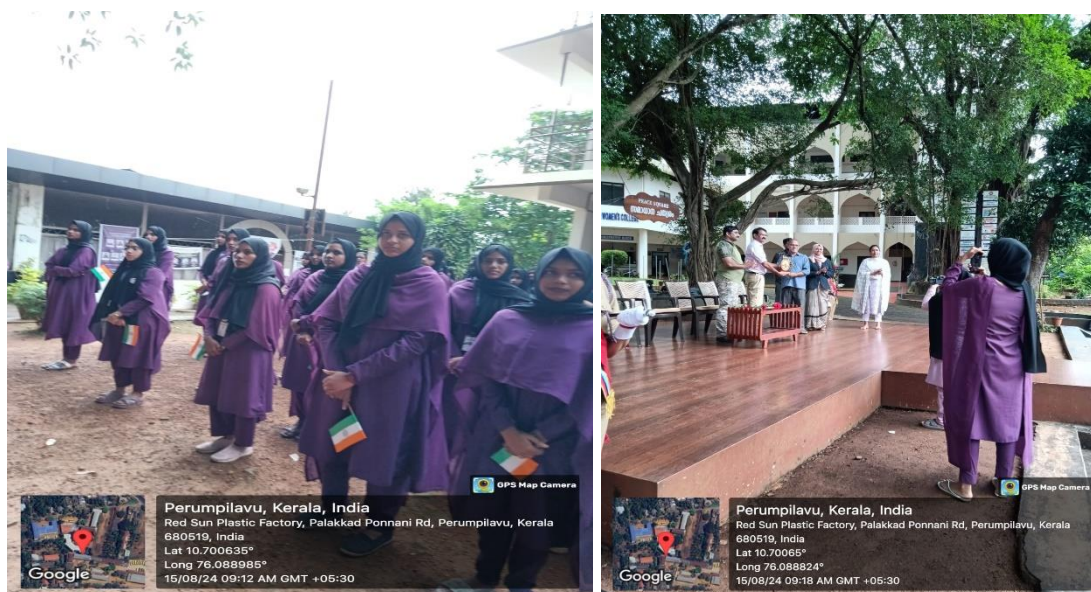
2. Paper Bag Making Workshop

9. NSS Special Camp



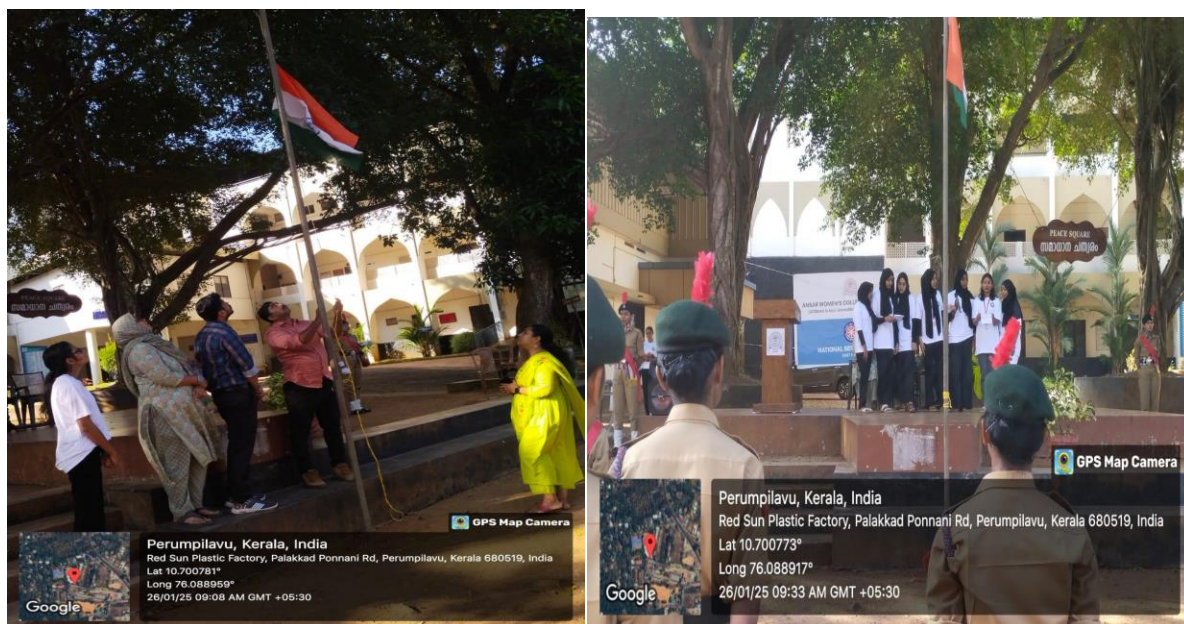

10. Republic Day

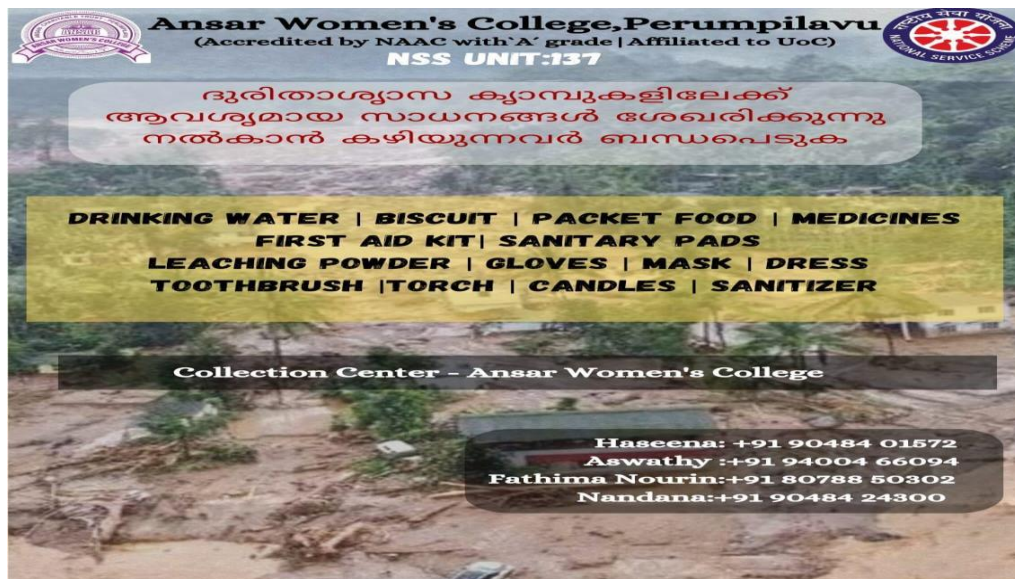

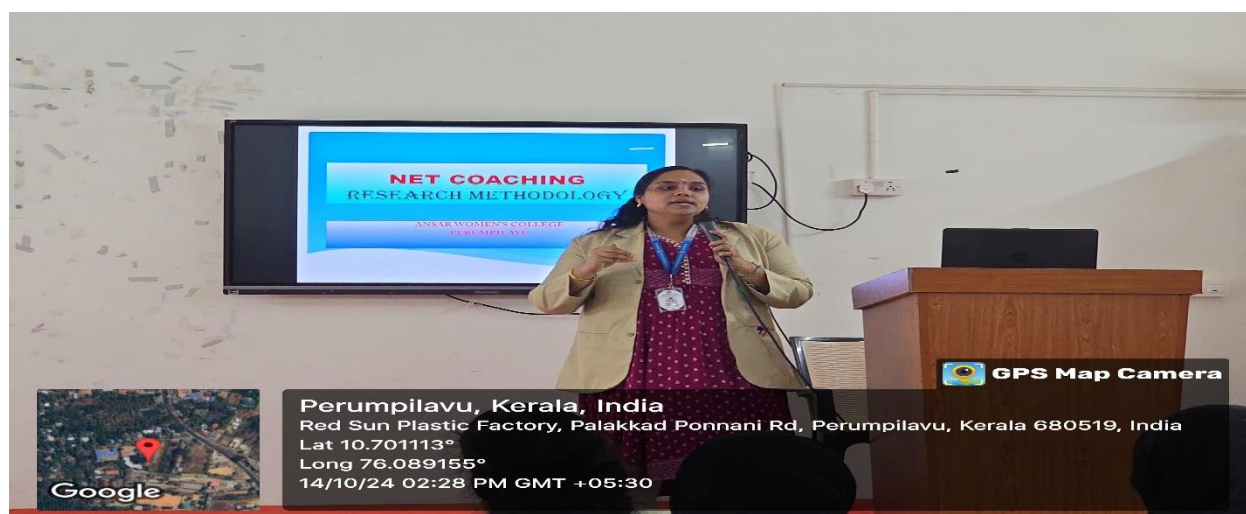
NET COACHING CELL

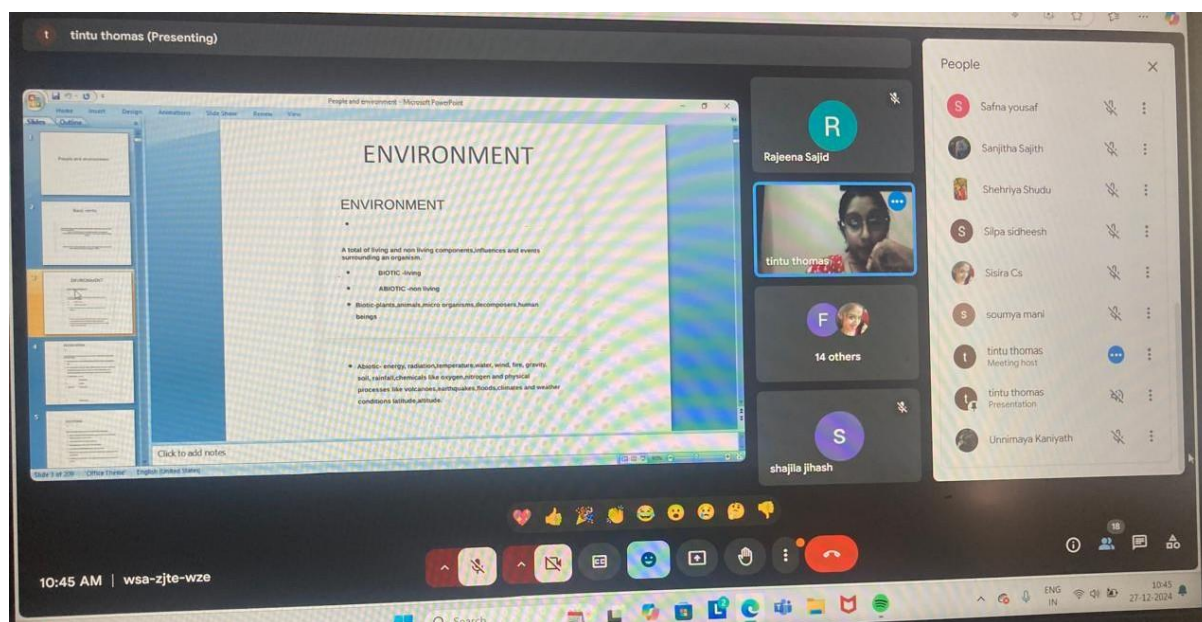

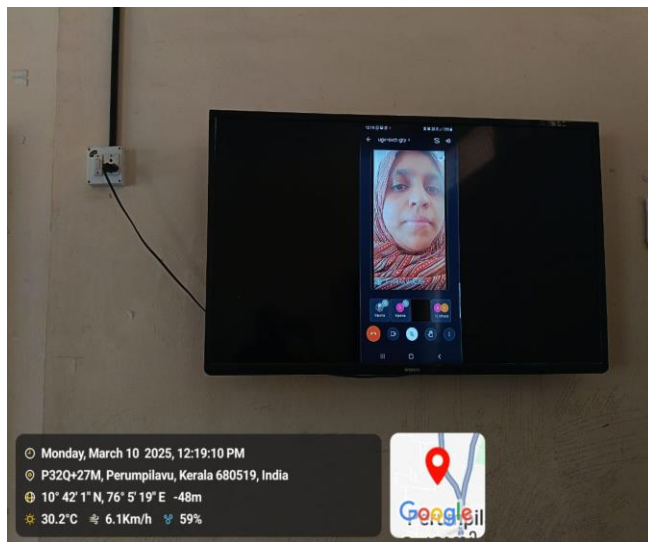
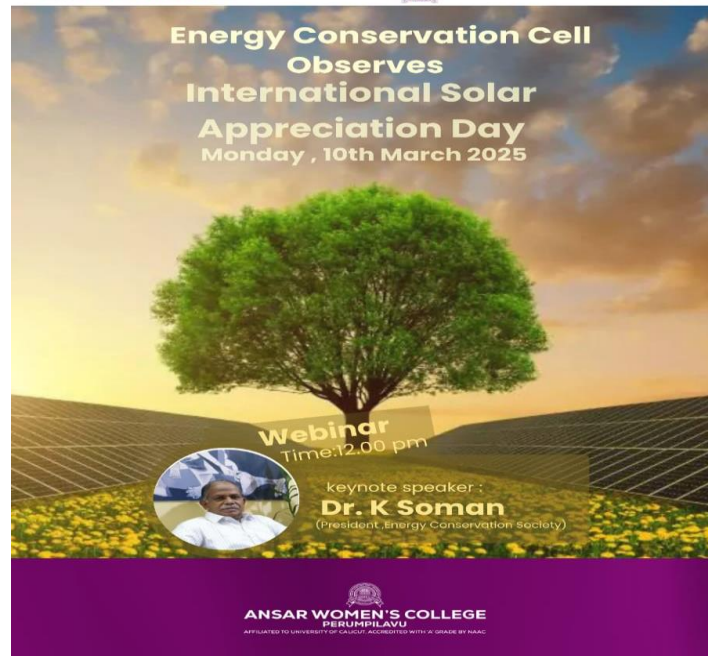
WEBINAR-INTERNATIONAL SOLAR APPRECIATION DAY

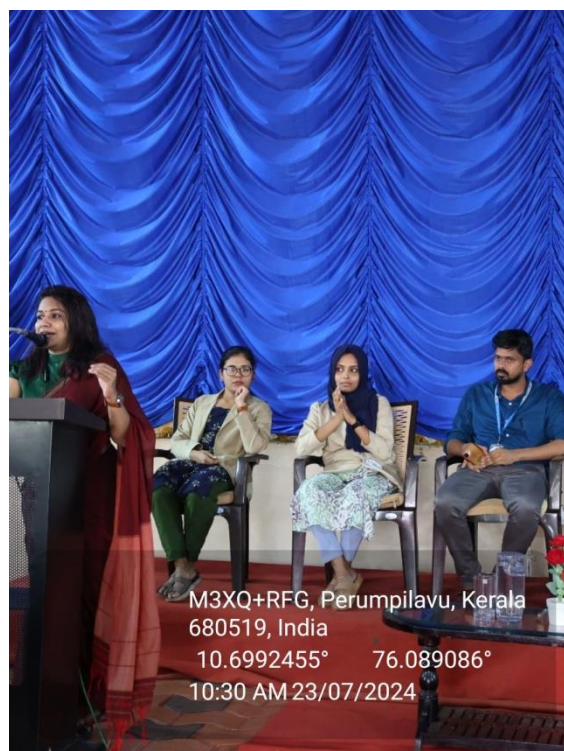

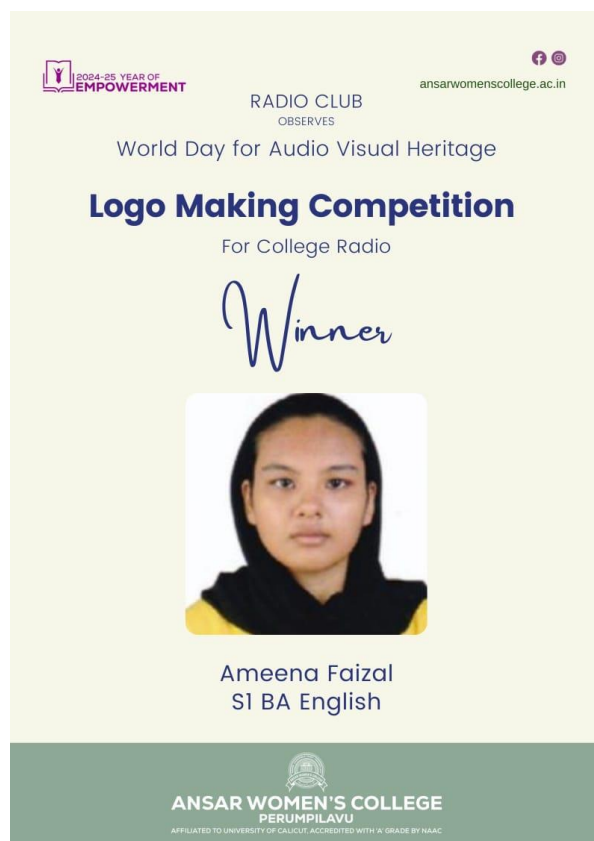
Radio Club organized various Programs from June 2024

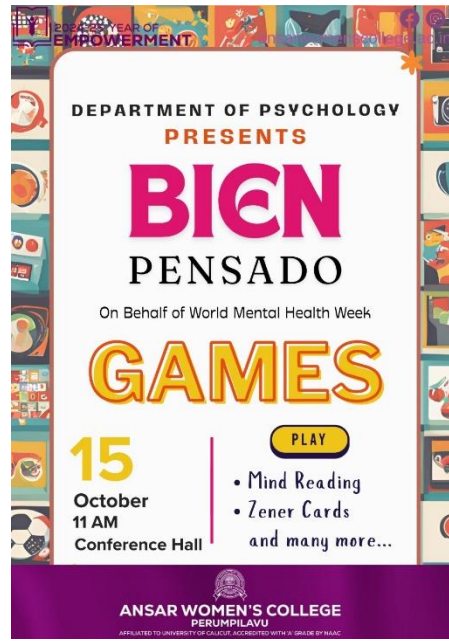
REPORT ON LAUGHING THERAPY SES

Psychological game program in celebration of World Mental Health Week



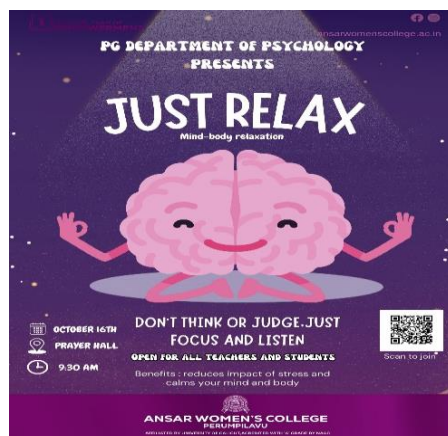

REPORT ON FLASHMOB EVENT DURING MENTAL HEALTH WEEK



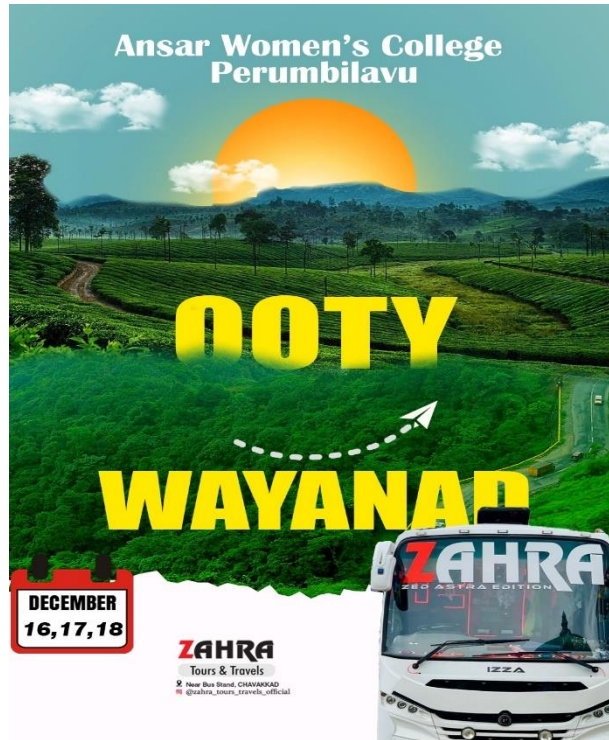

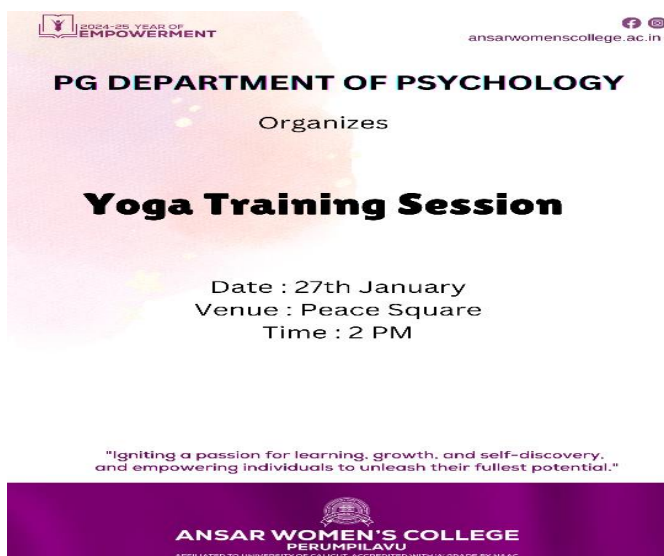

Report on Eco-Friendly Program: Yoga Training Session





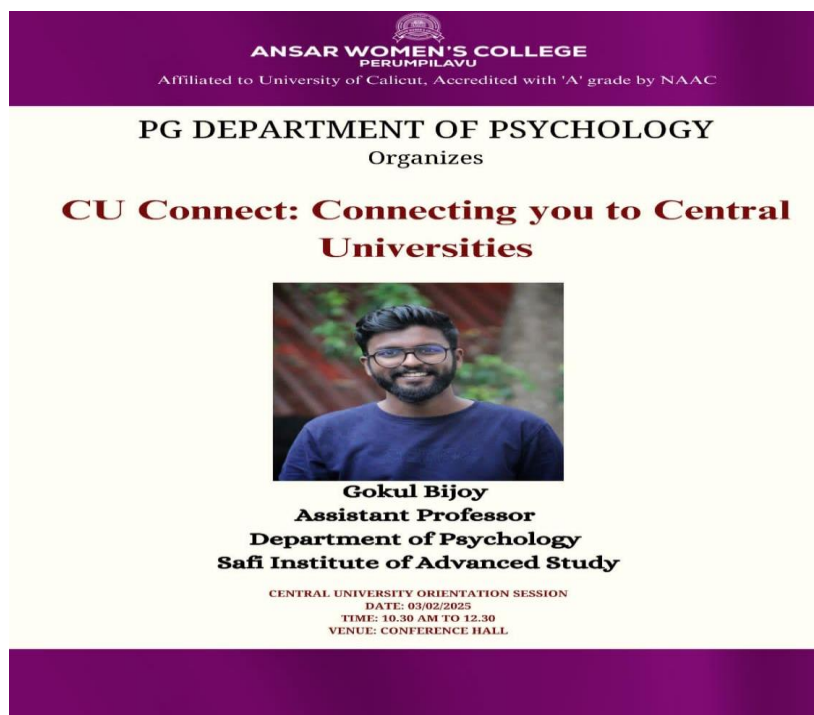

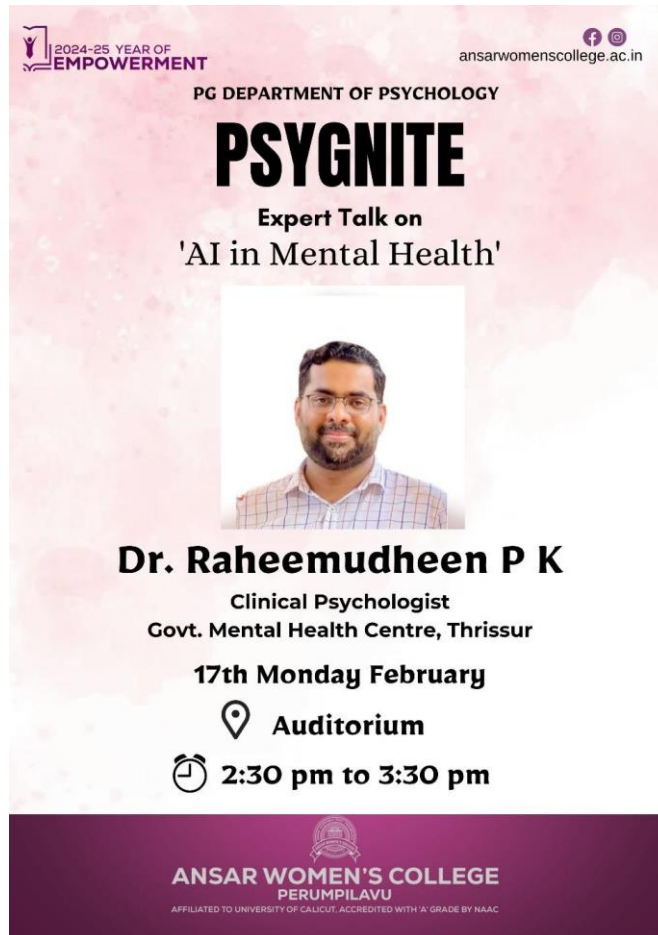

ASSOCIATION INAUGURATION & ALUMNI INTERACTION

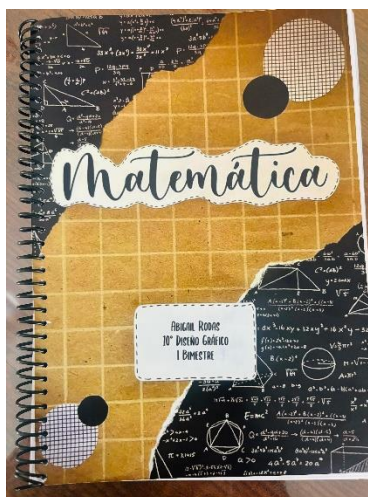

1. Reels reads (Reader's day observation)

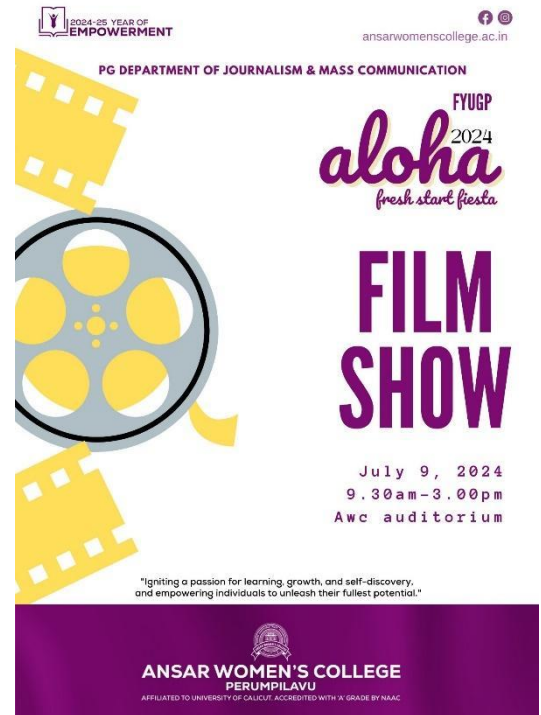

8. Industrial Visit

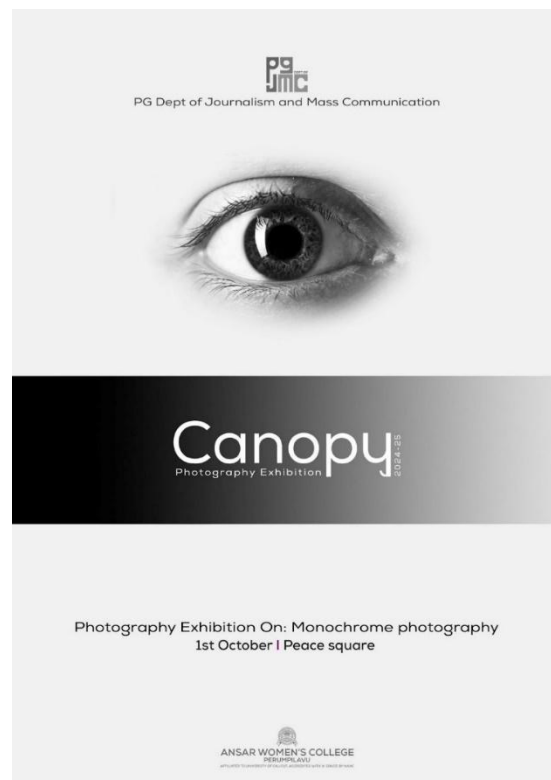

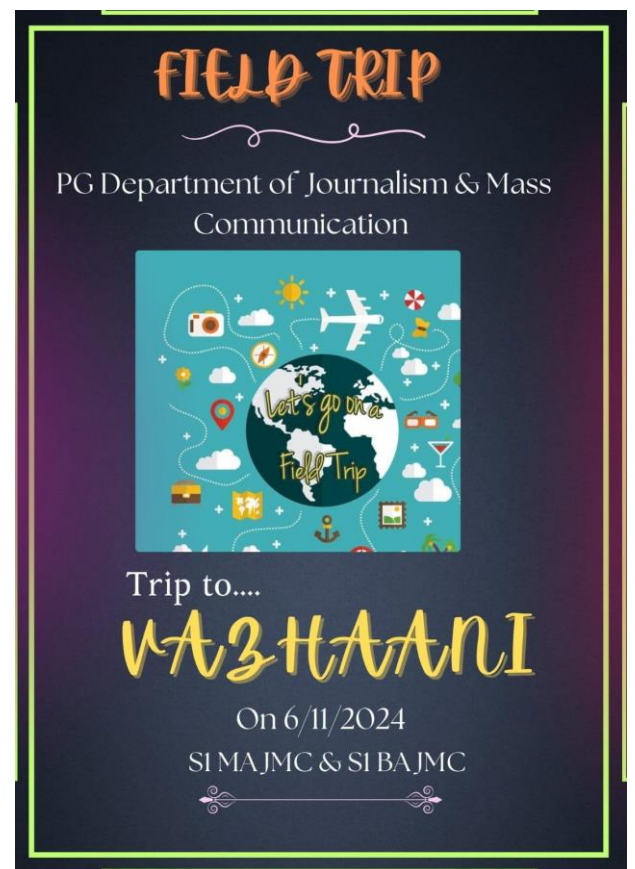




12. Field Trip

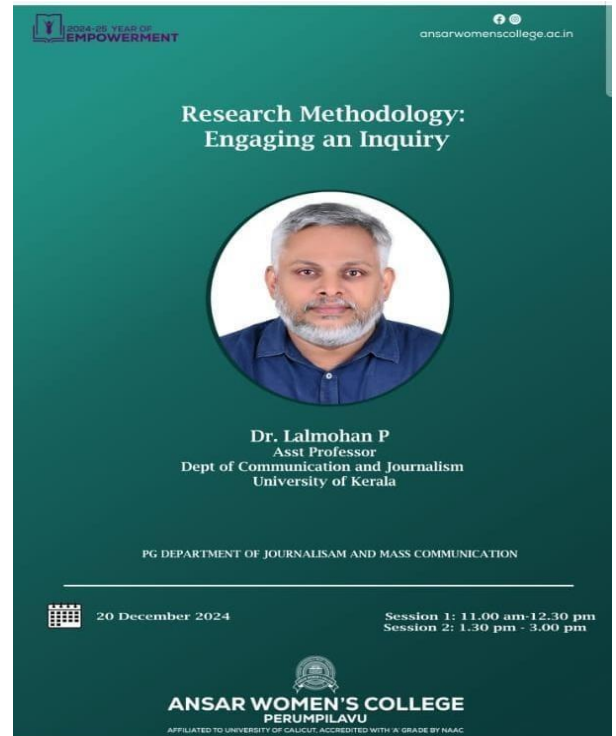

15.Seminar (Women & Children in Legal system)

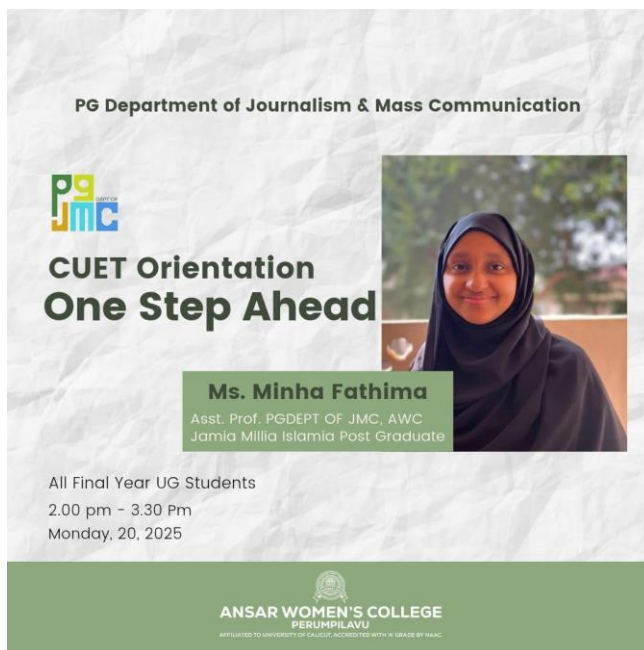

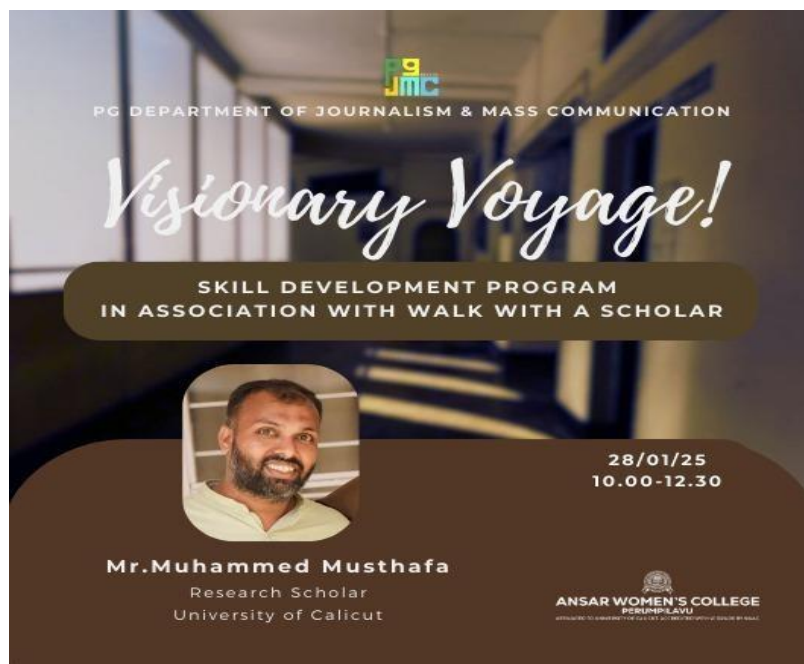


18.Soft Skill Development Program

20. Studio Inauguration

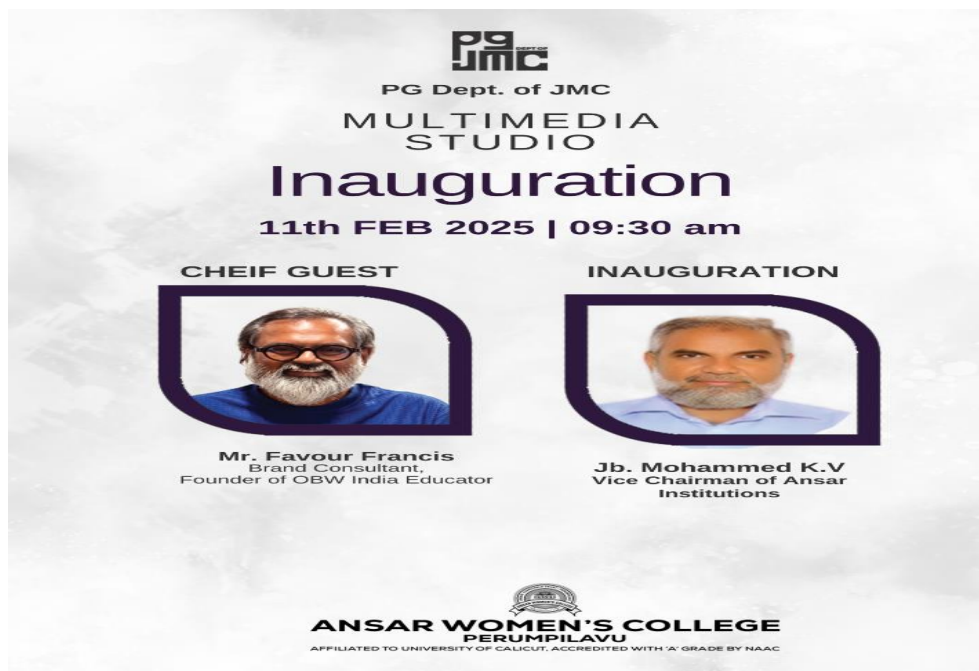

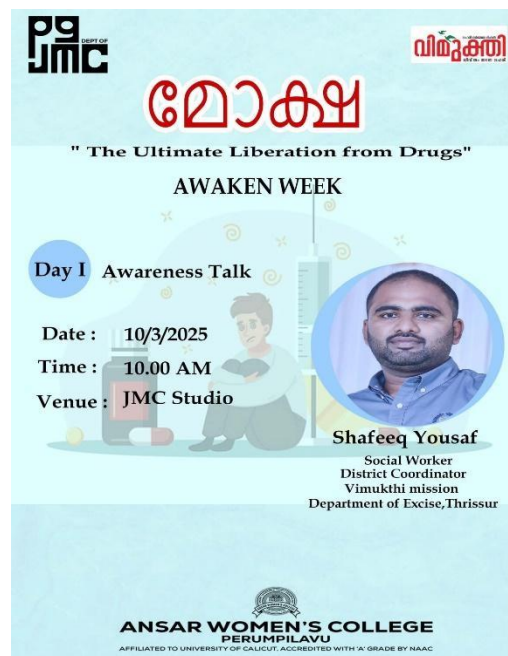


25. Anti- Narcotic Awareness Program

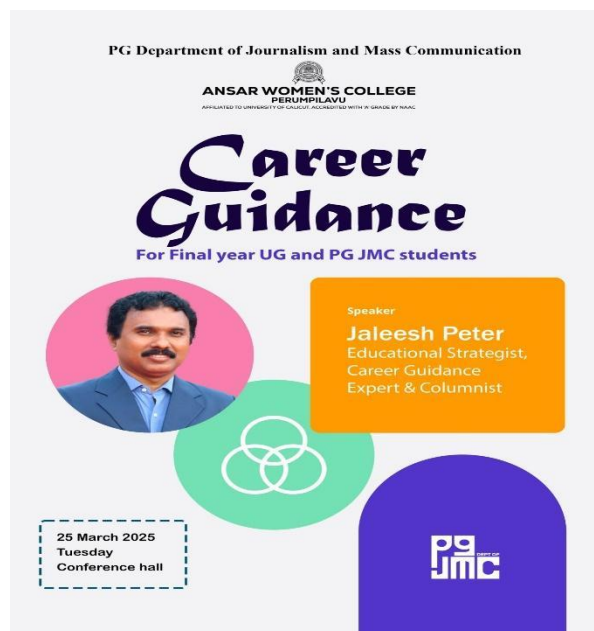

READERS DAY-24/06/2024

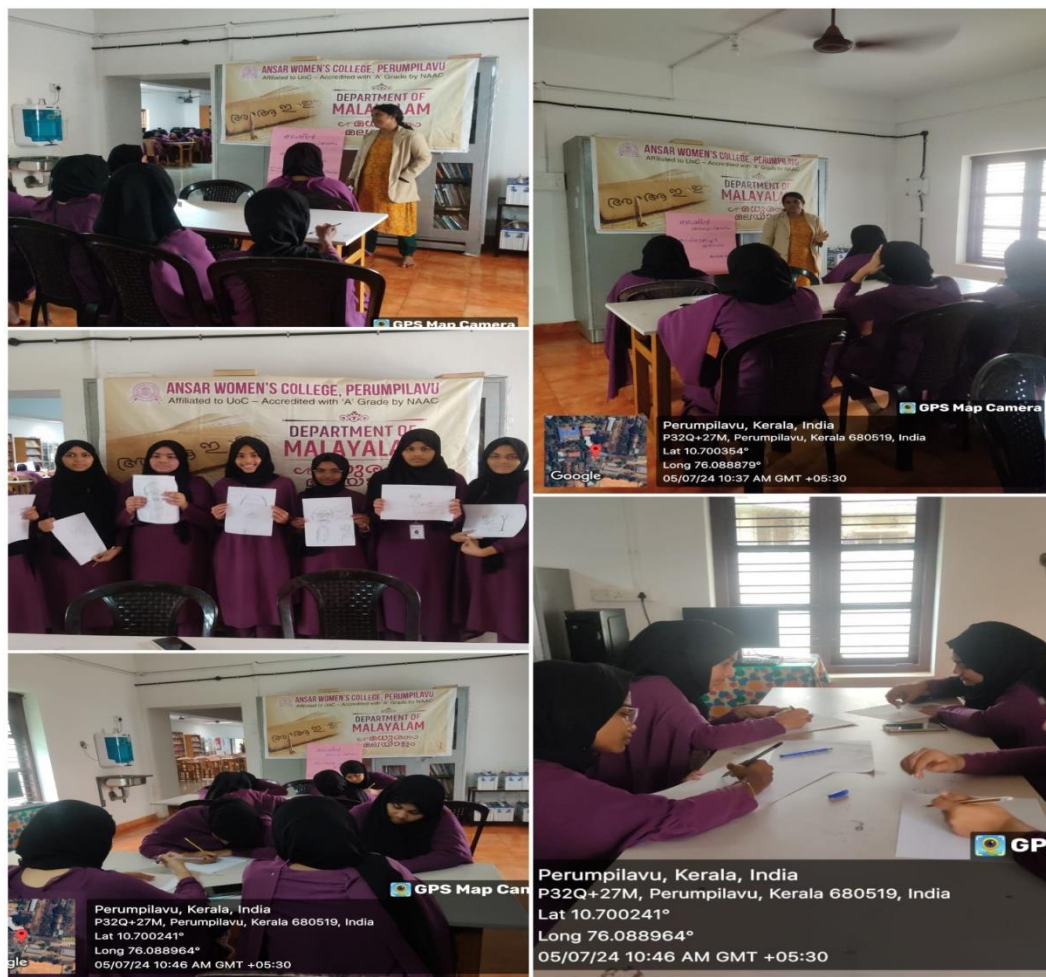

Study Tour

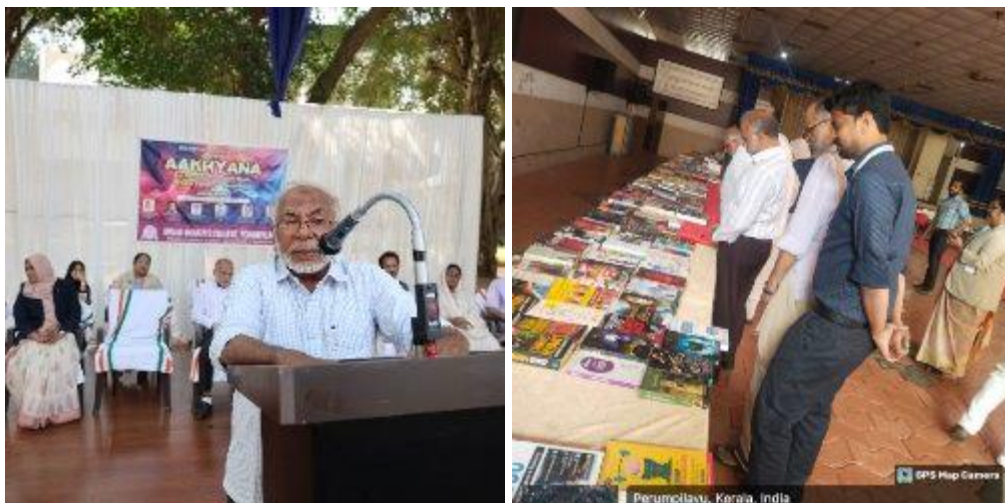
The Department conducted a two-day trip with second-year students of UG on November 10th to Munnar and Wagamon. 33 students and 3 teachers participated.

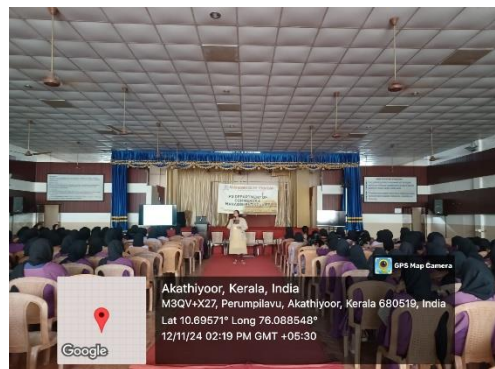

The students of Ansar Special School showcased their talents through captivating dance and music performances. Their enthusiasm and confidence left a lasting impression on the visitors.

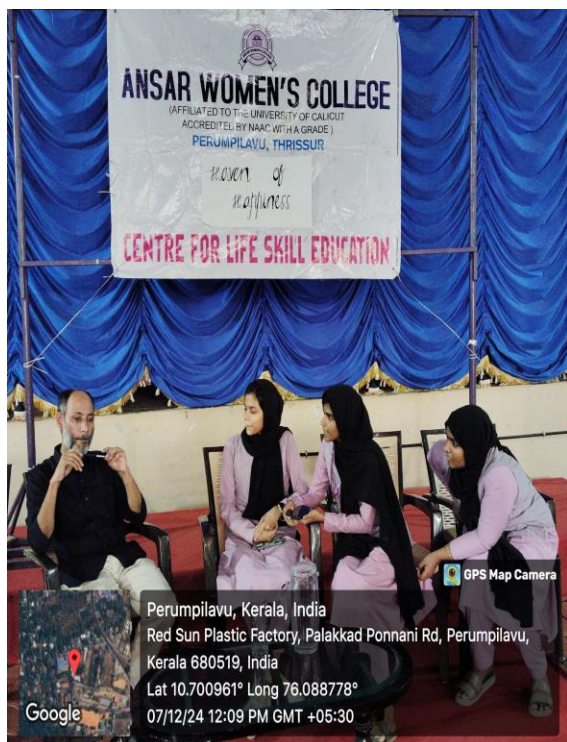


9. Haven of happiness (7/12/24)

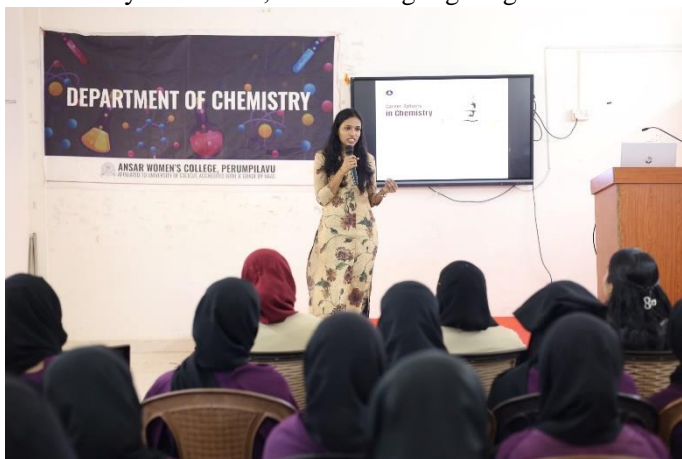
INDUSTRIAL VISIT (JANUARY 27, 2025)

FAREWELL 2022-25 BATCH

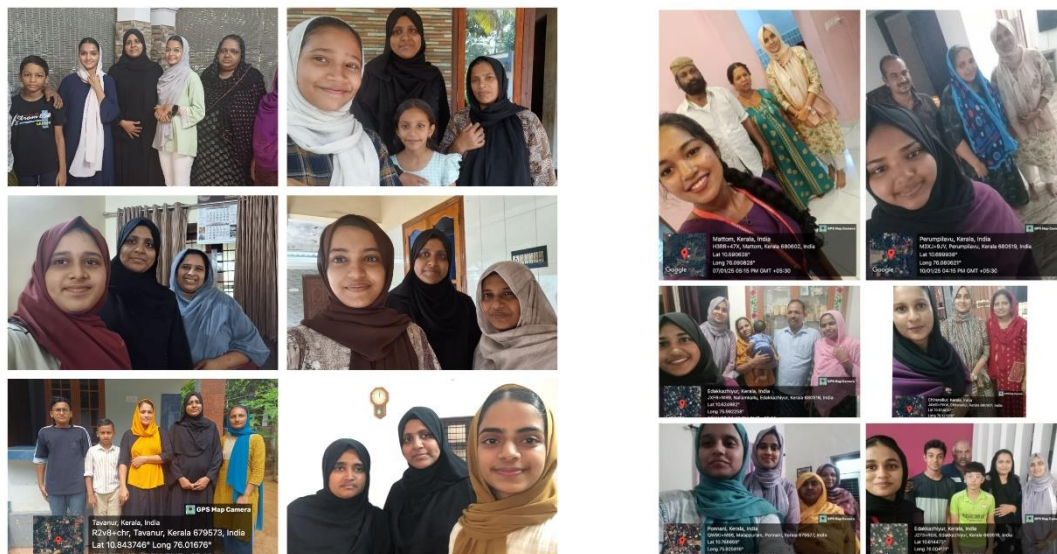
(FEBRUARY 26, 2025)
