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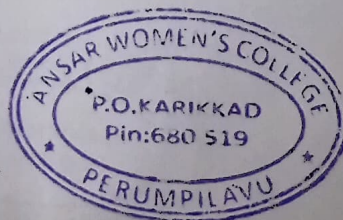
waste segregation bins. The enthusiastic participation of everyone involved made it a memorable occasion, successfully raising funds for community service through the Ashwas Fund.
